# J.C. Airoldi March 22nd at 6:45 pm

J.C. Airoldi is a Bostoncentered artist who specializes in landscapes in oil and pastel. She treats each painting as an individual journey, taking time to experience the wonders she finds everywhere in nature. She has a studio in Amesbury

which she shares with a group of other artists.

She earned her BFA from Massachusetts College of Art and Design in Boston. After starting an internship during her junior year, Airoldi went into commercial graphics, which involved creating storyboards, character portraits and special effects animation for computer game companies for almost 10 years. She then became a lead artist, designing websites for clients, including Dunkin' Donuts, BP, and Blue Mercury. In 2002, J.C. Airoldi began painting professionally.

J.C. is also an elected artist member of North Shore Art Association (Gloucester) and Rockport Art Association. She was published in a feature article in American Artist Magazine November 2008 and contributed to American Artist's Special Edition: The Complete Painter's Handbook, April 2012. She has over 20 years of teaching experience that include weekly classes and traveling workshops.

Another example is color coded xylophone and keyboard keys make it easier to read music.

I joined the Dedham Art Association in 2021. The monthly artist demonstrations have been a pleasure and inspiration to watch. This fall, one of my paintings was accepted in the Fall Exhibit at the Walpole Library. This was my first time being in an exhibit, and it was an honor to have my painting included with all the other great art work.

# Trip to Museum of Fine Arts, Boston Hokusai at the MFA! April 5th

Catch the Hokusai exhibit at the MFA with the Dedham Art Association on **Wednesday, April 5th.** From the MFA--"The exhibition brings together more than 100 woodblock prints, paintings, and illustrated books by Hokusai with more than 200 works by his teachers, students, rivals, and admirers. These unique juxtapositions demonstrate Hokusai's influence



through time and space — seen in works by, among others, his daughter Katsushika Ōi, his contemporaries Utagawa Hiroshige and Utagawa Kuniyoshi, the 19th-century French Japonistes, and modern and contemporary artists including Loïs Mailou Jones, John Cederquist, and Yoshitomo Nara." The plan is to take the MBTA commuter rail in and

The plan is to take the MBTA commuter rail in and get off at Ruggles Station (ten minute walk through Northeastern's campus, 1/3 mile) and get to the MFA for the 11:00am entry of the show (Please buy your timed tickets in advance.) Depending on who is attending, we can either take the Needham line (Needham Center and Hersey stations), or the Franklin Line ((Dedham Corporate, Endicott and Readville Stations.) Of course anyone is welcome to drive in and meet us there. After touring the exhibit, people with extra time can meet and discuss the show over lunch at the MFA cafeteria. Covid rules prevent the MFA from providing us with a dedicated guide, but we can pre-discuss on the train to be better prepared for what we are looking at.
